EXHIBITION RULES

1. The rules for judging adopted by the Camellia Society of Central Florida shall be used.
2. Competition shall be opened to all exhibitors: amateur or professional.
3. Flowers entered must be from plants owned by the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the opening of the show.
4. Unprotected blooms are those from plants bloomed in natural surroundings or in a slat or shade house which provides shade but does not provide protection from the elements of nature such as temperature, precipitation, etc.
5. All entries shall be attached to their own stems, no more than 2" long, with 1 or 2 leaves either attached or placed with the entered bloom.
6. All entries in Division I, II and III shall be marked as to flower size (small, medium, or large-very large) as noted in the SCCS nomenclature with the smaller size listed being the determining factor in case of two sizes listed. An exception to this are the miniatures, where if listed as miniature-to-small, will be classified as a small.
7. Entries shall be accepted from 7 to 10 AM on the morning of the show. All entries become the property of the Camellia Society of Central Florida and will be destroyed at the end of the show to prevent the spread of the petal blight.
8. Entry cards will be furnished at the show and must be filled out in accordance with the Horticultural Schedule.
9. Containers will be furnished for all entries.
10. Awards will be delivered to the winners by the Show Committee.
11. Decisions regarding classification and placement will be done by the Placement Committee. Any bloom considered not of show quality may be discarded at the discretion of the Show Committee.
12. Decision of the Judges shall be final.
13. A treated entry is one that has been chemically treated with a substance to induce early or enhanced bloom.
14. A novice is an exhibitor who has never won an award in any show. This includes having previously won a novice award.
15. An award may be withheld if there is not a blue ribbon entry for that award.
16. All entries must be marked whether treated or untreated to be eligible for Best Bloom Unprotected awards.
17. Best Local Bloom: must be a member of the Camellia Society of Central Florida and the bloom may not be entered in any other Division.
18. Jerry Conrad Heritage Bloom Award: bloom must be of a variety registered prior to 1900. Can be Unprotected or Protected.
