EXHIBITION RULES

- The rules for judging adopted by the American Camellia Society shall be used.
- 2. Competition shall be opened to all exhibitors: amateur or professional.
- 3. Flowers entered must be from plants owned by the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the opening of the show.
- 4. Unprotected blooms are those from plants bloomed in natural surroundings or in a slat or shade house which provides shade but does not provide protection from the elements of nature such as temperature, precipitation, etc.
- 5. All Blooms must be marked as Treated if they have been treated with an agent to enhance it or induce it to bloom early.
- 6. All entries shall be attached to their own stems, no more than 2" long, with from 0 to 2 leaves either attached or placed with the entered bloom.
- 7. All entries in Division I shall be marked as to flower size (small, medium, large, very large) as noted in the SCCS nomenclature with the smaller size listed being the determining factor in case of two sizes listed except for miniatures to small which will be classified as small for the show.
- 8. Entries shall be accepted from 7 to 10 AM on the morning of the show. All entries become the property of the Camellia Society of Central Florida and will be destroyed at the end of the show to prevent the spread of the petal blight.
- 9. Entry cards will be furnished at the show and must be filled out in accordance with the Horticultural Schedule.
- 10. Containers will be furnished for all entries.
- 11. Awards will be delivered to the winners by the Show Committee.
- 12. Decisions regarding classification and placement will be done by the Placement Committee. Any bloom considered not of show quality may be discarded at the discretion of the Show Committee.
- 13. Decision of the Judges shall be final
- 14. A novice is an exhibitor who has never won an ACS award in any show. This includes having previously won a novice award.
- 15. An award may be withheld if there is not a quality entry for that award as determined by the Head Judge.
- 16. Only Show Committee personnel shall move blooms at any time.
- 17. Blooms entered as Local Blooms must be from CSCF members.
