

Rules

1. The show will be judged by accredited judges of the American Camellia Society.
2. The most current policies and of the American Camellia Society apply.
3. All entries must be classified and placed between 7:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. on November 8, 2014. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR COMPETITION AFTER 10:00 A.M.
4. All Exhibits will be tagged and ready for judging at 10:00 A.M. (Use tags as follows. –Class A, C, E, G, I, K, O, P, Q, - White; Class B, D, F, H, J, and L – Green; Class M – Pink; Class N – Red)
5. Those not having won three or more Head or Honor Table Trophies in the past, may enter blooms in the Novice Class (N).
6. There is no restriction on chemically treated flowers.
7. More than one bloom on a single stem will disqualify the entry. Each entry must show either one or two leaves.
8. All blooms entered must have been grown by the exhibitor and the plant must have been in his/her possession at least 30 days prior to the show.
9. Exhibitors need not be members of any Camellia Society.
10. Only one ACS sanctioned trophy may be won by a single bloom and no trophy will be given for the categories not listed in this printed schedule. The Carrie L. Caddie Local Award will be given to the Best bloom in the show.
11. Award will be presented to the winner of the most blue ribbons. In a tie, red ribbons will also be counted. Sets of certificates will be awarded for both protected and unprotected divisions.
12. Judges are invited and encouraged to bring blooms for competitions. However, they must disqualify themselves when their exhibits are being judged.
13. If only one bloom of a variety is entered, it will constitute a class, and it will be judged against the standard of perfection for that variety and the ribbon at the discretion of the judges.
14. Judges may refuse to award a ribbon or trophy in a given variety or class if they deem the entry to be below show quality.
15. Blooms that have sizes specified as a range in the Nomenclature book may be entered as either the smaller or larger size at the discretion of the exhibitor.
16. Protected is defined as flowers grown in green houses, lath shades, or similar structures.
17. Historical Class – Class Q – Blooms of cultivars introduced before 1946 (Registered date in the S.C.C.S. Nomenclature Book) may be entered in this class and will be judged against each other for the Best Historic Bloom and runner up.
