The recipient of this year's Award of Merit is William Lee Poe, Jr. Lee is well known in the camellia world and to all of you in attendance. Lee has worn many hats in his lifetime to include various responsibilities in a 38 year career with E.I. DuPont de Nemours & Company. Educated as a chemical engineer, he continues to tackle numerous projects with intensity that few of us can match.

Lee has held multiple positions in the camellia societies to include SC State Director for (2001-2002) and President of the ACCS (2004-2006). Under his leadership, the educational programs at the annual meetings were strengthened and the need to increase membership was encouraged. He has been chairman of the Aiken Camellia Show for a host of years and is considered the leading expert in the care and culture of camellias throughout the central Savannah River area and far beyond.

Lee has been the primary author of a book, *Aiken County Camellia Cultivars*, which pictorially illustrates all the seedlings registered in Aiken County. Through his vast research, information about the original growers is also included.

Lee Poe has been an inspiration to many camellia lovers over the past seven decades. One of his noted characteristics is his ability to develop and inspire others through his extensive knowledge of camellia care and culture.

The Atlantic Coast Camellia Society held its thirtieth annual convention on September 17 and 18, 2010 at the Litchfield Beach and Golf Resort. The convention was a wonderful beginning for the 2010-2011 Camellia season.

Guests began festivities with a tour of colonial Hobcaw Baronv-Bellefield Plantation. The Board of Directors handled the business of the Society in the af-All present members ternoon. gathered for the welcoming party Litchfield-by-the-Sea the in Beach House with its breathtaking views and noises of the rolling Atlantic Coast surf and churning sands. Beach sounds competed with joyous, happy conversation as camellia friends caught up with news and gossip. Many participants had not seen each other since the last spring Camellia season.

The welcoming party and the sumptuous barbecue dinner kicked off the convention on a very positive note. After a night's rest, participants continued the togetherness in the morning after breakfast with drinks and camaraderie.

The General Meeting began at 10:00 with President Glenn Capps presiding. Afterwards was the fund-raising auction known as the "Buck and Bill Show." In the afternoon members experienced an informative talk on "Behind the Scenes at Brookgreen Gardens" with its worldclass sculpture exhibits. The second education program of the afternoon was "how to" directions for bark grafting and fertilizing camellias. The Atlantic Coast Camellia Society is fortunate to have noted horticulturist and owner of Loch Laurel Nursery in Valdosta, Ga., Dr. Mark Crawford, as a member. Mark's presentations are always great. He manages to squeeze in for our edification, the results of his latest camellia research.

A Judge's Re-accreditation Symposium was conducted by Geary Serpas and Elaine Smelly. The instructional format included answering questions and concerns of the students who were already accredited judges. All were apprised, through input from the principals and the judges, the major changes to the judging rules since the last official printed publication of the American Camellia Society. The session was graded A+ by students.

The convention concluded Saturday evening with dinner. The speaker was Miles Beach, another of our ACCS members.

Miles' talk centered around the propagation and preservation of the 478 "ancient" camellia cultivars known to have come to the United States. Miles was one of the principals in forming the Great Gardens of America Preservation Alliance (GGAPA).

In addition to trying to obtain and save the "ancient" camellias the GGAPA has expanded its efforts to include the saving of the "Historic" camellias introduced between 1900 and 1960. more information on this subject, please read, "The Impossible Dream Is Coming True," by Douglas Ruhren, Horticulturist, in The Camellia Journal. 
